The USGA Museum and Arnold Palmer Center for Golf History is the world's leading institution in collecting, preserving, interpreting and disseminating the historical developments of the game, the USGA and its championships. Created in 1936, the USGA Museum is the oldest museum in the United States dedicated to sports. In the years since we were founded, the Museum has amassed the world's premier collection of golf memorabilia, comprising more than 70,000 artifacts that tell the story of the game's rich history, evolution and growth.

The players, programs, photographs and printed materials contained in the scrapbooks are an important link to the history and legacy of women and the game of golf.
